Dear Friends,

"There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens." ~ Ecclesiastes 3:1

As the number on our calendars change from one year to another, we often reflect on the past, the highlights of the past year. The joys and the struggles come to mind before we sing Auld Lang Syne.

These moments of reflection often happen at the start of a new year, a birthday, or during times of transition. When I began to reflect on this past year, I realized this was my 10th Christmas season as a pastor. I also celebrated the last birthday I will have in my thirties.

These points in time can feel like liminal spaces between what was, what is, and what is to come. If you were to journal or chat with a trusted friend, how might you answer the following questions: What do you hope for in the year 2025? What do vou desire to remain the same or change?

I know one person who chooses a theme or phrase for each new year. Another decides on a number of

things they want to try throughout the next twelve months. There is so much we plan for and I wonder how are those dreams shaped or strengthened when we invite God to participate in that future? Where was God in the midst of this past year and where do you hope to see God in the days ahead?

As we hear in Ecclesiastes, there is a time for everything. The author offers a litany of opposites: a time to plant and time to uproot, a time to tear and a time to mend. Nothing remains constant forever. Perhaps as we transition from one year to another, we can reflect on what seasons have defined this past year. Interestingly, we might discover that rarely do we live in just one part of the dichotomy listed in Ecclesiastes. We can encounter new life as we experience death. We may find that before something can be mended, it must be first torn. Even mourning can be paired with times of joy and dancing.

There is so much we cannot anticipate, new relationships, opportunities and also loss. However, through it all we can trust that God is with us on the journey. As we enter a new and unknown chapter of our lives, I share with you one of my favorite prayers that could be a

staple for you in this year:

Lord God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths untrodden, through perils unknown Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

For McCarty, knitting is a ministry

Anyone who knows Sherry McCarty knows she loves to knit and to help people. Since 1997, when she and her family joined Grace, she has been combining both through the church's knitting ministry.

While the ministry was started by others, Sherry is now in charge, along with Chryss Hartman. In all, the ministry has provided hundreds of knitted prayer shawls, baby hats for newborns and small pocket-size prayer squares – something McCarty initiated during the COVID-19 pandemic – for those who need a take-along reminder that God is with them even in their most difficult times.

For Sherry, knitting is a way not only to spread God's love but also to give back to Grace and its members who were there for her during her own time of need.

The Grace connection started in 1996. Her husband, Mike, was in the hospital's intensive-care unit. While neither Sherry nor her husband were members of Grace at the time, they had friends who were.

"Mike was Catholic. I was Methodist. When Mike ended up in the emergency room, our friends from Grace asked Pastor Pat and Pastor Julie to visit him in the hospital. One of them was there every day to visit. The pastor from my mom's Methodist church drove up to the Quad-Cities to visit. The Catholic chaplain at the hospital called on him, but no one from the Catholic church came to visit. When Mike was released from the hospital and was feeling stronger, he said he wanted to go to church at Grace. I agreed, so in March of 1997 Mike and I, and our daughter, Katie, joined Grace as a family," she says.

Mike's health continued to worsen as the years progressed — two kidney transplants, dialysis, an ostomy, diverticulitis that ruptured, heart issues and then melanoma. He and Sherry spent more time in hospitals both here and in Madison, Wis., than out, she noted.

Members of Grace were there for them throughout, having fundraisers, providing food, offering moral support and plenty of prayers.

"I am a believer that God will give you what you need. Every time there was a fundraiser, Grace people were involved. A couple from Grace held a fundraiser. The Grace family was very supportive and instrumental in helping us," she says.

At 11:30 p.m. March 10, 2016, a half-hour before his birthday, Mike passed.

Throughout all the health challenges and financial difficulties that resulted, McCarty said her "faith was strengthened" through the love and kindness of the Grace family. "God does bring you to the other side. It might not be how you want it to be. I didn't want to lose Mike, but that wasn't my decision," she says.

Even though she was the primary caregiver to her husband, Sherry found time to knit, be on the church council for four years and even help with Sunday School.

"It's a small way of me paying it forward," she says. "I hope those who helped us through know how their thoughts and prayers were so appreciated. I hope the congregation knows how appreciated they were at the time and how much they still are."


Puzzle Exchange & Afternoon Fun



Council Corner

Stewardship

Thank you to Grace members for helping us meet our commitment of giving challenge! We have exceeded our campaign pledge goal and have met the \$24,000 challenge gift pledged by a few generous donors to pay off Grace's mortgage at year-end! A celebration is forthcoming!

Endowment

The Endowment Committee have been reviewing the financial effectiveness of Grace's Endowment. They have shared a draft of a "Reserve Policy" to restructure Grace's Endowment and move partial funds to the Quad Cities Community Foundation with the intention of increasing the funds financial gains and usage. The next step is to revise Grace's Constitution language and present changes to our lowa's ELCA Southeastern Iowa Synod for review and approval prior to re-presenting to Council and taking it to a vote with the Congregation.

Security Grant Application Status

Council approved a formal "Procurement Policy" as part of the application process for our Federal Security Grant funds with the State of Iowa.

2025 Nominations for Council and Committees

Russ Finkler, Chair of the Nominations Committee met with Council on the status of filling important vacancies. The committee has developed a Nominations Committee description and outlined the process and responsibilities for individuals who are nominated. Council members completing their tenure in January will be Jim Bayles, Cindy Lee, and Deb Kirby.

Please mark your calendar for the upcoming annual meeting date at 10:30am after a joint worship service at 9:30am on Sunday, January 26. Participants will be able to attend via Zoom as well. Council has approved the 2025 presented budget in December, but a majority vote of the congregation will be needed to pass it along with the slate of Council members.
