## Dear Friends,

When I was in High School, I sang in one of the school choirs. One year we joined two other high schools and the Omaha Symphony in singing Handel's Messiah. Over one hundred teens crowded onto risers singing for over two hours.

Two songs have stuck with me. A foreboding song, Dies Irae by Mozart was included in the selections that night. The lyrics describe the Last Judgement with the dead rising and the book of deeds being opened. The music conjures feelings of terror and panic as God's judgement and

wrath confront the listeners.

In contrast, the Hallelujah Chorus captured a sense of triumph, praise, and celebration. The cascading lyrics of "He shall reign for ever and ever" created a bubbling feeling of joy. A never-ending promise realized. This composition attempts to capture the victory of Jesus over death.

Both songs convey emotion and invite you to not only imagine the story they are telling but help you experience it. To accomplish this, one must rely on the conductor, musicians, and an angsty group of teenagers singing in a chorus.

You may have noticed, I don't chant or sing the Kyrie. In part, it's stage fright. I become so anxious my voice cracks, I somehow manage to get lost, or sing off tune. I am not a soloist. Yet I enjoyed singing in a choir. I could lean on the person next to me; they helped me feel more confident in what we were singing. Together, the chorus became a wall of sound as we sang the final "Hallelujah." My singular voice became one with the voices around me.

Much like a chorus, a congregation works to create something beautiful

together. As a community we praise God, serve God and share the Good News. Individually, we each bring our own unique gifts and talents that enhance the collective.

#### Over the past year:

- We created a memorable VBS Day Camp with two other churches, collectively, serving 60 children.
- We grew in faith through study of God's story in Bible Studies and in Spiritual Growth opportunities.

Additionally, with the Thrivent card we were able to put together 22 personal care kits.


## **Story of Paul Bible Study**

### Fair Trade: Transforming Food Systems

#### Research Companies' Commitments to Human & Planet-Centered Policy

Look for companies working on advocating for policy that impacts everyone, not just their bottom line. Find out about their governance structures and who owns them. Prioritize buying products from brands that have official policies that place people and the planet over profits.

#### **Prioritize Local**

When eating out, consider the establishment you are supporting. Many big national and global restaurants do not prioritize local farmers or sustainable production. They work with big whole sale restaurant food distributors to keep their costs down.

#### Visit Farmers Markets

Visit farmers markets in your neighborhood and support those farmers as much as possible, talk to them, care about how they farm with questions about their land and the workers, thank them for doing the hard work to provide us with healthy food.

#### Be an Active Citizen

Participate in political systems at the local, state, and federal levels. Learn who are prioritizing policies supporting farmers, workers, and the environment. Donate to them, and remember to VOTE for them!

Bring your non-perishable food donations in a bag, and leave at the altar before the service. Let's make this our best year yet! Go to localfoodbank.org/whatdo-food-banks-need-but-dont-ask-for/ for info about if you need ideas.

Donations Needed: nonperishables - especially canned fruits and vegetables, canned & dry beans, canned meats, pasta, pasta sauce, rice, breakfast items (cereal, oatmeal, etc.)

Always Appreciated: peanut butter, jelly/jam, canned chili, boxed potatoes, protein bars, whole grain bread, fresh fruits & vegetables (donated directly to the pantry), items for baking (flour, sugar, baking soda, baking powder, etc.)

Consider: simple spices (salt, pepper, garlic powder, onion powder, etc.), neutral cooking oils, vinegars, powdered milk, powdered eggs, wooden spoons, handheld can openers, aluminum foil pans), cake mixes for special occasions
